

CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

We need a little help from our friends...

The amount of trail that the York County Rail Trail Authority can construct in a year is, to a large extent, dependent upon the amount of funding that we have from various sources. Through the generous contributions of many individuals in the greater York community, we had a successful capital campaign in 2006, raising over \$1.3 million. That source of funding has enabled us to leverage \$3.4 million in funding for PennDOT, PENNVEST, PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, York County Community Foundation, and other local, state and federal sources.

In an effort to stretch the capital campaign funds as far as possible, we have called upon the communities where our trail development projects are located to see what they can provide in the way of a grant match



through the contribution of labor and equipment. We recognize those municipalities that have stepped up significantly in 2012. In 2008, Hanover Borough built most of the first segment of the Hanover Trolley Trail, and in 2012 the Borough put down a beautiful new surface. Likewise in 2012, Jackson Township provided labor and equipment to help construct the newest section of the Hanover Trolley Trail east of Spring Grove Borough in the township. During 2013, Penn Township will step up and help with construction of yet another segment of the Hanover Trolley Trail, this one connecting to the west with the Hanover Borough section.

The members and staff of the York County Rail Trail Authority can't thank these municipalities enough for their support! We commend these municipalities for playing a significant role throughout 2012 in the success of these projects.

2012 PROJECTS REPORT

Hanover Trolley Trail

Jackson Township Phase 2 Complete

Under storm-threatening clouds, a ribbon was cut on August 20, 2012 officially opening the Jackson Township Hershey to Martin Road section of the Hanover Trolley Trail. This phase included engineering and construction of a ¾-mile trail section that connected to Phase 1 at Hershey Road and extended to Martin Road, paving of the Jackson Township parking lot, and native planting of an earthen berm. Funding was provided by a PA Department of Conservation & Natural Resources (PA DCNR) grant, with a generous donation of labor and equipment from Jackson Township and contributions from the Authority's TRAIL LINKS capital campaign.

Spring Grove Area Students "Dig" the Trolley Trail

Sixty students and their teachers from the Spring Grove Area Middle School spent the morning of Friday, May 4th, planting 40 trees and 800 flowering plants along a stretch of the Hanover Trolley Trail in Jackson Township as part of the Jackson Township Phase 2 development project.

The project was designed to (1) introduce native plants into the trail surroundings for the benefit of wildlife and enjoyment of trail visitors and (2) provide a safety separation between a section of the Trolley Trail and a nearby active rail line. Jackson Township and



Spring Grove Borough contributed equipment for mowing and watering; Brown's Orchard of Loganville donated apples for a snack. Contracts with Sylva Native Nursery of Glen Rock, PA and Ecosystem Recovery Institute, Inc. of Freeland, MD provided the plant materials and planting instructions, respectively.

Northern Extension of Heritage Rail Trail County Park


During 2012, Phase 2 was divided into two development projects: bridge & ramps; trail & parking lot. Following a public bidding process, Kinsley Construction Corporation was awarded the contract in

February to construct the bridge and ramps for a crossing of the Codorus Creek at Emig Road. As the creek continued to provide challenges to installing the pier support system, the project experienced several delays and a re-design of the western pier's foundation became necessary.

In April, the Rail Trail Authority received a \$921,656 grant from the Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority (PENNVEST) for development of the trail and parking lot.





Hanover and Spring Grove Boroughs and Jackson Township collectively gave 199 hours and \$5,314 toward maintenance of the Hanover Trolley Trail. Jackson Township donated labor and equipment totalling \$59,309 toward construction of the Hanover Trolley Trail in the township. Hanover Borough donated labor and materials totalling \$11,600 to resurface the Hanover Trolley Trail in the borough.

Sacred Heart Parish Center Youth Group conducted 11 monthly inspections and performed light maintenance on the Spring Grove-Jackson Township section of the Hanover Trolley Trail. **Spring Grove Area Chamber of Commerce** adopted the Hanover Trolley Trail: Hershey to Martin Rds. Section for three years.

Affinigent, Inc. donated \$2,605 in web services, and **Eysters** donated office space and utilities valued at \$13,350. **Millersville University** provided Jared Hogentogler to serve as a summer intern in the YCRTA office.

In March 2012, the Rail Trail Authority launched an electronic counterpart to its semi-annual printed newsletter, *Trail News*. *E-Trail News* provides monthly construction updates to nearly 250 individuals, government agencies, and business partners.

2012 Heritage Rail Trail User Survey & Economic Impact Study

York County Department of Parks & Recreation, assisted by the Rail-to-Trails Conservancy's Northeast Regional Office and York County Rail Trail Authority, conducted a survey of visitors to the Heritage Rail Trail throughout the summer of 2012. The survey was a follow-up to previous studies conducted in 1999, 2001, 2004, and 2007, each of which was designed to provide demographic information on visitors to the Heritage Rail Trail as well as an analysis of the economic impact of the rail trail to the local economy. The study was funded by the York County Community Foundation, and the final report will be published in early 2013.
